
Where can you get involved?

How can you find the right place of assignment?

Search for a suitable location under "Einsatzstellensuche" [search for a place of assignment] or ask an advisor on site.

Report to the assignment location and set a date for an introductory interview without obligation.

If it's what you're looking for, sign the agreement and start with the Federal Volunteer Service.




